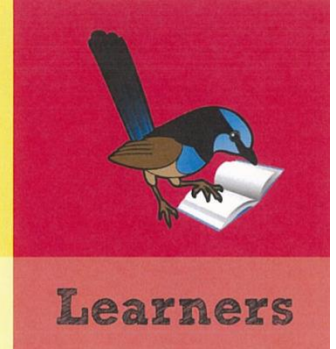
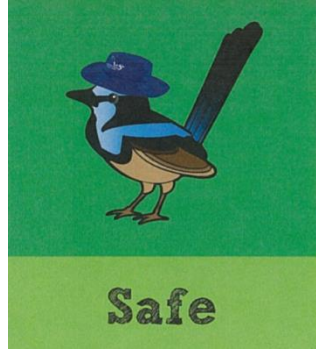

Visitors

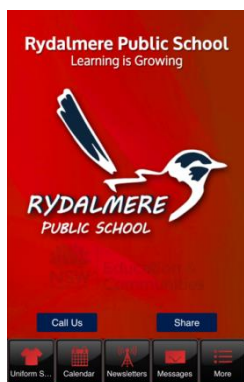

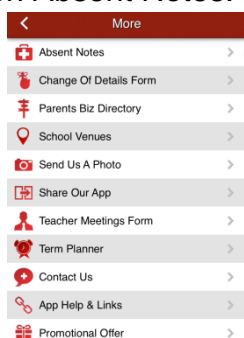
Check the time school starts. DON'T BE LATE!

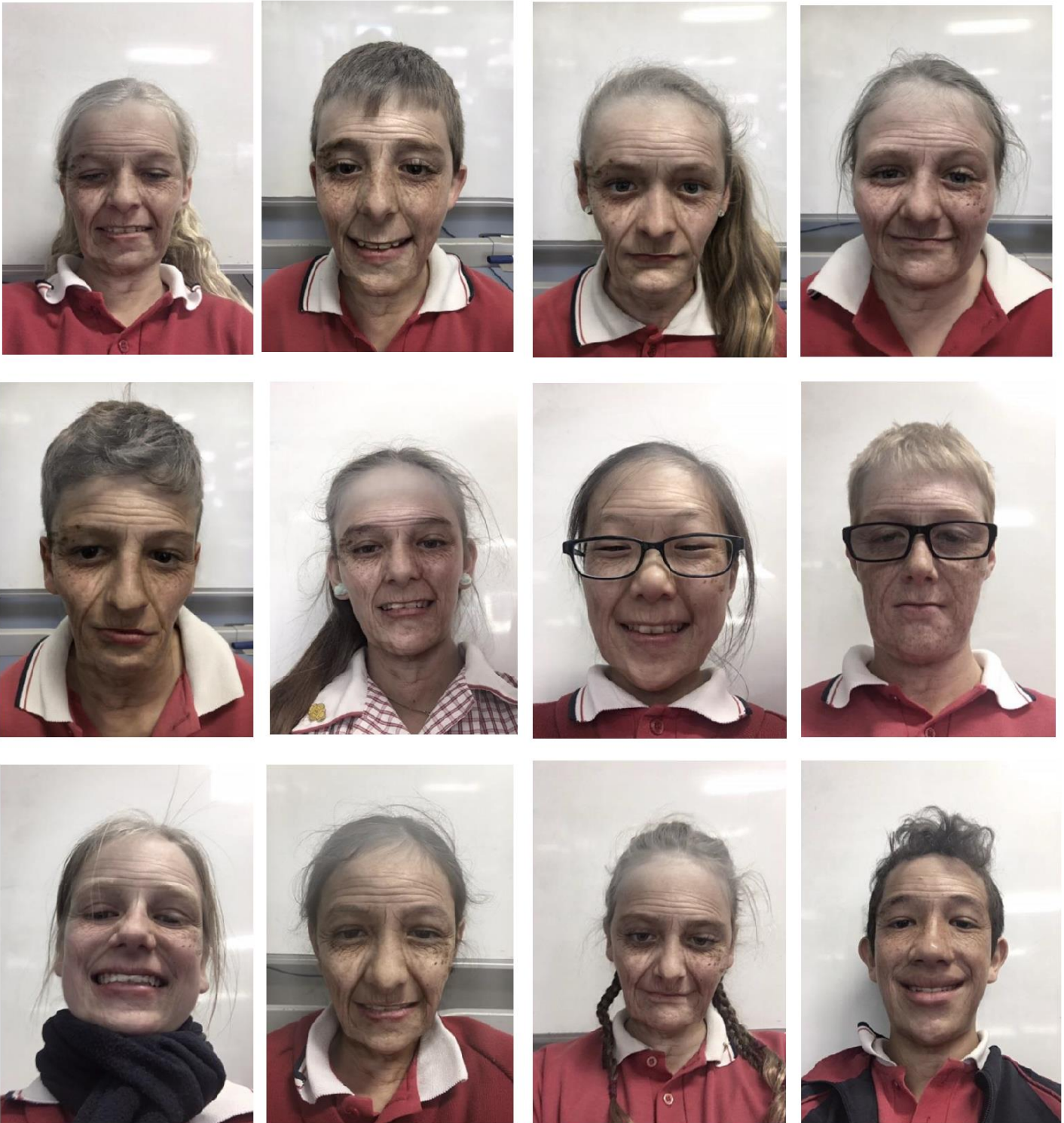
WHAT'S HAPPENING IN PRESCHOOL

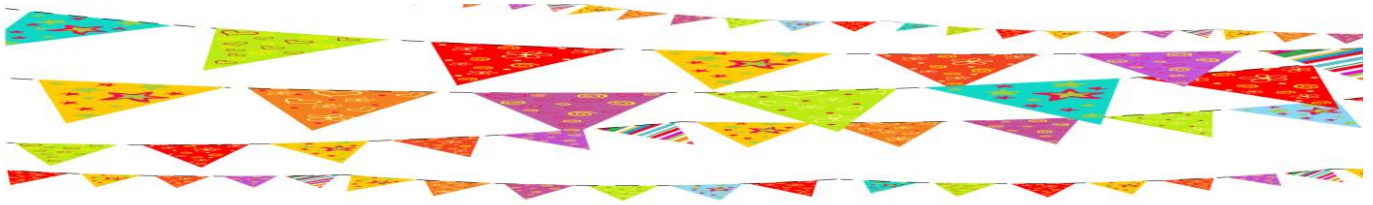

Do you enjoy cooking? Ever daydream being on a cooking show?! How about trying out new cuisines from all over the world?

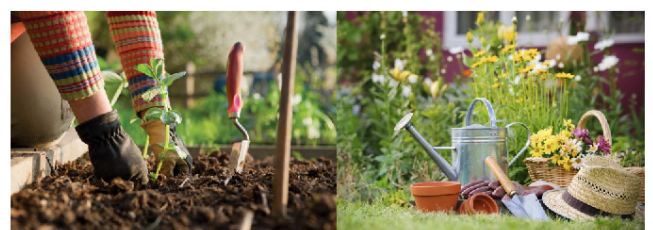
