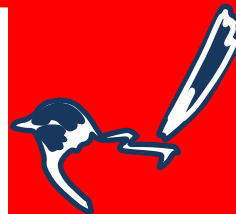

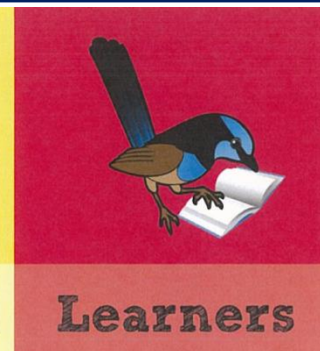
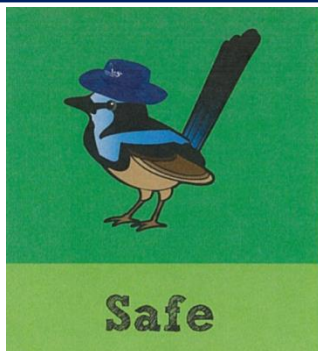

## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

### Education Week

Thank you to all of the families that joined us for our Education Week celebrations. It was lovely that we could have you here for open classrooms and our annual Education Week lunch. The disappointing part of the day was that, due to the awful weather, we had to postpone our outdoor Assembly. On a positive note, we will advise all of our families soon of a new date and time for this assembly. The children are looking forward to performing for you. I would like to share my Principal's address in this report for those parents who are not able to make it to our Education Week Assembly:

*Good morning parents, grandparents, family members, staff and students. Welcome to Education Week and to our Open Day at Rydalmere PS. Education week is celebrated each year in NSW Public Schools to showcase the wonderful things our students do each day during their learning time. 2016 brings the 62nd year of this annual celebrati-*

*on and with it the theme of "Shared stories, better learning, stronger communities".*

*Now this may seem like a bit of a long-winded theme, but the core of this theme is the significance that public schools, and in our case, that Rydalmere PS plays in fostering relationships between students and their families, the staff and our community.*

*"Shared stories" is particularly fitting, because we all have a story that led us to the 'common ground' that is RPS. Some of you were on a journey to somewhere....you weren't sure where, but you landed on your feet here. Others knew they were destined to have Rydalmere as part of their journey.....because they lived in area or because it is a tradition in their family to come here. # Should you give your children pocket money?

Pocket money can be a tricky topic between parents and children. How much do you give? What age is the right age? Should you give pocket money at all?



Pocket money can help teach children from a young age about the value of money and how to look after it.

### *How should you give pocket money?*

A survey by CommBank found that almost 80 per cent of parents in Australia give their children pocket money.

The survey also showed that the most popular way to give children pocket money is in return for doing certain tasks. This can help children understand that money needs to be earned.

Popular tasks include:

- Household chores
- Good marks at school and completing homework
- Helping in the community
- Good behaviour.

These situations can be a win-win as children can better appreciate the value of money while you get some help and also incentivise good behaviours.

It's important to bear in mind that you also don't want to foster a mindset in your child that they should be paid for everything they do in the house, or add a financial pressure to success which could add stress.

## What to do?

If they can, encourage them to add up the amount of money earned themselves and work out the total.
